# Right royal look at the park now on CD

THE Royal National Park is home to some of Sydney's most beautiful native flora.

Now plant lovers can learn more about the many species that grow there with the help of an interactive CD developed by the Australian Plants Society's Sutherland branch.

Members spent five years making the CD which contains more than 1200 colour photographs and information on 300 plants.

The *Coastal Plants of the Royal National Park* CD sells for \$20 and can be used to find out more information about plants that visitors see when taking the coast walk.

The society is a voluntary organisation dedicated to educating people about native Australian plants.
